1. Final payment for cruise is due June 10, 2008
2. Secure a passport in time since we will be traveling outside the US borders and it is now a requirement to have a passport to re-enter the US (we don't want to leave anyone behind!)
3. When you have your passport, there is an advance registration process that must be completed with Norwegian Cruise Lines. You can go on-line and register at NCL.com OR for those who don't have computers, you can call Barbara Reeser, at AAA Reading-Berks, to complete this process. 4. Travel Insurance—if you haven't purchased and feel this is necessary for you, you will still have time to purchase up until final payment is made on June 10, 2008.

You should make two copies—one to take with you as a backup (in another location and not with the original passport) in case you happen to lose the original; the second one keep as a backup at home. 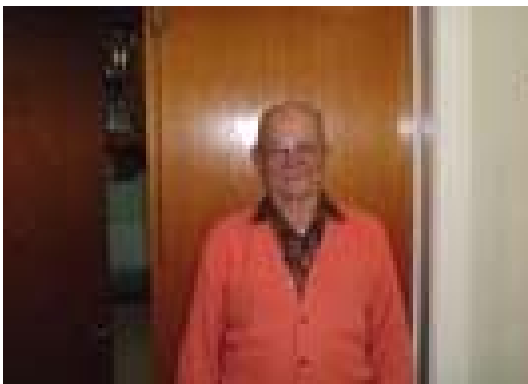

- * Pomona Grange will turn over the tables and chairs (used during the Reading Fair in the food tent) to the Reading Fair Board
- * Attendance: 33 brothers, 43 sisters, 23 juniors and 1 mini-junior—total of 110
- * Audit Report was presented and approved
- * March Pomona will have youth in charge and Gail Switzer in charge of program
- * Next haus & game night is scheduled for March 1, 2008
- * Angel tree gifts were presented this evening
- * Next Consignment sale date: August 23, 2008
- * Several Grangers were present in Lyons when Dennis Wolff made a presentation
- * Marie Switzer reported that a Christmas party was held at Berks Heim
- * Betty Yeager reported that a change in administrators has taken place at the Hamburg Center
- * Wernersville State Hospital gifts were delivered Nov. 13
- * After January 15, 2008, cruise cabins (for Pomona tour) will be released to the cruise company and if anyone is still interested they may book, but a cost differential might be in effect.
- * Membership stands at 1,486
- * Fern Kulp was the contest corner winner
- * State Grange President, Betsy Huber, was elected Chairman of the National Grange Board of Directors
- * The Grange is taking a “misleading labeling and advertising” of food products to PA Attorney General’s office
- * PA State Grange is opposing the EPA’s new 8-hour ground-level ozone standard
- * William Steel, National Grange master, retired in November
- * Received a thank you for our contribution to the Farm Family Appreciation Celebration, 2008
- * Ernest Miller, Pomona delegate to State session, reported that a dues increase was denied by the delegates. However, National Grange still passed the dues increase. Therefore, PA State Grange will need to make up the amount needed to be forwarded to National Grange without a PA dues increase
- * Controversy on BST policy as well as “truth in labeling” issue
- * Junior program was given \$3,108.84 (20% of the consignment sale profits)
- * Resolution to support Berks County Grange Youth Ambassadors was presented and approved, starting with 2007 royalty.
- * Juniors provided \$300 to hay project for North Carolina
- * 2008 County Junior Camp theme is “sea creatures gone wild”
- * Juniors collected 734 pounds of soda tabs for Shriner’s project

Our number one industry, agriculture, is in a position like never before in our times. The government has issued a two word statement which brought about this change—Energy Independence. At first glance, it seems like a bonanza for our farmers. However, the farmer now has to produce feed for cars, trucks AND their cows and chickens. Chickens cannot run on oil, but cars can run on corn (ethanol). This is putting a major drain on our crops. Farmers are benefitting from a short time price increase in corn, wheat and beans. But, they must not take the riches and run! They need to check the prices of next year’s needs—fertilizer, seeds and fuel. The apple cart is upset and it is going to take very good management to put all the pieces together to stay on top.

Think about the old story of the man who had a pickup truck and bought 100 watermelons from his neighbor for \$1 a piece. They sold fast at \$1 a piece. He counted his money and then realized he needed to buy a larger truck.

7. All qualified contestants will be placed in their respective medal level and winners will be chosen at the 2009 Recognition & Appreciation Banquet. Good Luck!

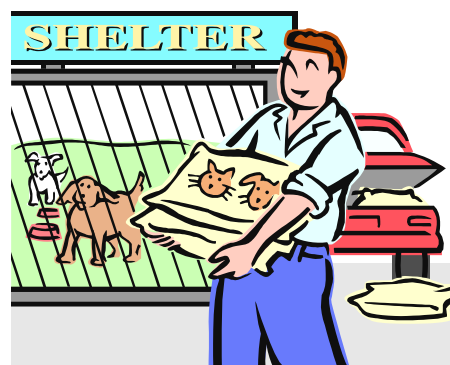
Lecturer's Report
